Canadian CT Head Rule

CT head is only required for minor head injury patients with any one of these findings:

High Risk (for Neurological Intervention)

- 1. GCS score < 15 at 2 hrs after injury
- 2. Suspected open or depressed skull fracture
- 3. Any sign of basal skull fracture*
- Vomiting ≥ 2 episodes
- Age ≥ 65 years

Medium Risk (for Brain Injury on CT)

- 6. Amnesia before impact ≥ 30 min
- Dangerous mechanism ** (pedestrian, occupant ejected, fall from elevation)

*Signs of Basal Skull Fracture

- hemotympanum, 'racoon' eyes, CSF otorrhea/ rhinorrhea, Battle's sign
- ** Dangerous Mechanism
- pedestrian struck by vehicle
- occupant ejected from motor vehicle
- fall from elevation ≥ 3 feet or 5 stairs

Rule Not Applicable It:

- Non-trauma cases
- GCS < 13
- Age < 16 years
- Coumadin or bleeding disorder
- Obvious open skull tracture
